Take Peter, he is a regular up to chapter 12 of the book of Acts and makes a final walk on appearance in chapter 15 before Paul and his colleagues take over Luke's tory.

It's the story of Cornelius who is given Peter for a season and in doing so Peter finds Cornelius helps him understand God a little bit more as Luke continues to relate how the way church worked back in the early days as a series of seasons of discovery by groups of people as more and more are welcomed.
