Mark 14-15: This is the story of Jesus' passion. I suggest you read it through at a sitting and then go back and reflect on each incident.

- Be with the woman who poured her perfume sacrificially on Jesus, and reflect on your own giving of yourself to God.
- Be with Jesus and His disciples in the 'spacious' room which had been prepared for the Passover meal, and reflect on whether you are clearing a spacious place for God in your heart and life.
- Be present at this gathering and notice how you feel. Let Jesus pass the bread and wine to you. Is there anything you want to say to Him at this moment?
- Be present in Gethsemane and see Jesus suffering intense inner pain. How do you feel as you watch Him. Can you say, '*I want your will, not mine*'?
