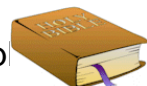

Spiritual Living

If you were to ask me point-blank: "What does it mean to you to live spiritually?" I would have to reply: "Living with Jesus at the centre." There are always countless questions, problems, discussions and difficulties that demand one's attention. Despite this, the person of Jesus has come to be more and more important to me. Specifically, what matters is getting to know Jesus and living in solidarity with him. There was a time when I got so immersed in problems of Church and society that my whole life had become a sort of drawn-out, wearisome discussion. Jesus had been pushed into the background or had himself become just another problem. Fortunately, it hasn't stayed that way. Jesus has stepped out in front again, so to speak, and asked me: "And you, who do you say that I am?" It has become clearer to me than ever that my personal relationship with Jesus is the heart of my existence. It is about Jesus, above all, that I want to write to you, and I want to do so in a personal way.

Jesus embraces not only vulnerability, but obscurity, too

The greatest part of Jesus' life is a hidden life. It is a life lived under the authority of his parents during which he grew to maturity and increased in wisdom, in stature, and in favour with God and people. Although the gospels remain silent about this period of Jesus' life, this silence is very revealing. It reveals that the good news is first of all that God came to live among us, to be Emmanuel, God with us, and to share the ordinariness of our daily existence. Jesus wanted to be known as we are known.
